
Re: Letter of Appreciation


Re: Letter of Appreciation



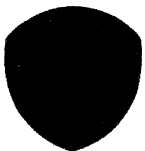
