A Work Session of the Douglas City Council was held on January 6, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 101 N. 4th Street, Douglas, Wyoming.
Councilmembers Present: Mayor René Kemper, Councilperson Kim Pexton, Councilperson Ron McNare, and Councilperson Monty Gilbreath; Councilperson John Bartling was absent.

Also Present: Jonathan Teichert, City Administrator; Chaz Schumacher, City Clerk; John Harbarger, Director of Public Works; Mary Nicol, City Treasurer/Administrative Services Director; Clara Chaffin, Community Development Director; Todd Byerly, Douglas Police Chief.

Discussion Regarding Board, Commission, and Committee Appointments: Council discussed the positions with vacancies and potential candidates for filling those positions. **Discussion and Review of City of Douglas Financials:** Administrator Teichert provided an overview of the City of Douglas year to date revenue and expenditures. Discussion followed. **Review of Regular City Council Agenda for January 10, 2022:** Administrator Teichert provided an overview of the upcoming city council meeting agenda. Discussion followed regarding the budget amendment. **Council Reports:** Councilperson McNare inquired into seeing a non-city dumpster at a local business. Director of Public Works Harbarger explained the business is aware they're still being charged for city refuse services. Councilperson Pexton inquired into the vandalism at the skate park. Harbarger stated the responsible person cleaned the park and the bathroom. Teichert stated water shutoffs are being postponed from today until the following week, due to the cold temperatures. Teichert shared that the DEQ permit came in for the Pearson Street project. McNare inquired into the status of Mr. Joe Burkholder's request to have the drainage ditch on his property cleaned out. Discussion followed. McNare inquired into community center. Teichert stated Cindy Porter with The Enterprise wants to meet with the school district, county, city, and Wyoming State Fair to discuss further. Mayor Kemper requested to have new pins ordered that reflect the updated city logo and the removal of "we know jack."
